

German-American Genealogical Partnership (GAGP)



The purpose of GAGP is for organizations in the United States, Germany and around the world to share and work together to help each other be more knowledgeable and successful. The partner organizations are currently working on the following projects.

Primary projects include: Make a list of speakers and topics, create a master list of German genealogical resources that exist, exchange periodicals, and hold a national conference every other year beginning in 2017.

Secondary projects include: Maintain a list of professional German genealogy researchers with their specialties, have a unified meeting calendar, create finding aids for each region in Germany, and identify how local societies can help visitors from partner societies.

Additional projects include: Create and share a list of German-American genealogical organizations, make a list of Germanic genealogy forums, create a checklist of how to best ask for help Germany, and document known immigrant databases.

As these projects are completed new projects will be undertaken. Some of the projects will be on going.
